# **Relationships**

How would you describe the relationships between the voluntary, community, faith and social enterprise (VCFSE) sector and your Integrated Care Partnership and/or Primary Care Network?



#### **Common goals**

What are the shared goals? Are they shared across all health and voluntary sector partners?



### Local structures

What are the local structures in the area and what are they responsible for? Do health agencies attend VCFSE-led forums?



#### Roles

How and who do you engage within the local Primary Care Network, for example? What are the roles you have come across?



### Navigating challenges

How do you make stuff happen if the relationship is hard to establish? What is there to build on, including opportunities for joint working?



#### Making connections

What cross-sector relationship(s) do you want to nurture or address? How can you build or connect relationship(s), and what have you got to help you?



#### Representation

Are the right partners and representatives around the 'table' (whether it is part of the Primary Care Network, Integrated Care Partnership, Integrated Care Community or another connecting structure)?



#### Valuing expertise

What parts of the voluntary sector expertise and experience are less valued (or known about) where you are? Where and how might they be part of the answer?
