

Introduction

We have a unique opportunity to make life easier for charities. We have seen what is possible in an emergency. The challenge now is for funders and VCSE organisations together to interrogate new behaviours and to nurture and grow the best of them into the future.

How can we build on the changes you have made so far, and sustain them for the long term? The first step is this survey - it will take approximately 20 minutes to complete. This will inform work led by IVAR and a steering group of funders and charities to capture recent experiences, and to share learning that helps to shape both future emergency approaches and general grant-making practice (e.g. stripping back application processes; reaching new groups or speeding up decision-making).

Multiple members of your organisation can complete the survey or you can gather views and provide a composite response. We are keen to hear from: grant staff; programme staff; grant managers; those in senior leadership roles; Directors/CEOs.

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
